6 PLAYGROUNDS TO OPEN.

La Guardia and Moses to Make a Tour of Inspection Tomorrow.

Six plLygrounds will be opened by the Department of Parks tomorrow —three in Brooklyn, two in Queens and one in the Bronx—it was announced yesterday. There will be exercises, including exhibitions of playground games, flag-raisings and band concerts, in each borough and Mayor La Guardia and Park Commissioner Moses will make a tour of inspection.

The Brooklyn playgrounds are at Snediker and Riverdale Avenues, Stillwell Avenue and Avenue U and in McCarren Park. The Snediker and Riverdale playground has an area of about an acre and that at Stillwell Avenue and Avenue U an area of approximately three and one-quarter acres. McCarren Park has been reconstructed.

In Queens the Highland Park playground, Jamaica Avenue and Cleveland Street, and the Laurelton playground, Brookville Boulevard, 135th and 137th Streets, will be for small children. The Croton Park playground, which will begin operations in the Bronx, is at 173d Street and Fulton Avenue.
